

Report on interactive session on “Career Options in the Indian Postal Services

Introduction

In line with its commitment to enhance student awareness regarding diverse career paths, the **Career Counselling and Placement Cell** of *Government Degree College, Nankhari*, organised an informative lecture on **2nd July 2025** on the topic: “*Career Options in the Indian Postal Services.*” The session aimed to familiarise students with the employment landscape in the Department of Posts, Government of India. It was especially insightful for students seeking stable, meaningful government-sector jobs.

Session Overview

The session was graced by two esteemed speakers from the local postal services:

- **Mr. Krishan Thakur**, currently serving as a Daak Sevak, and
- **Mr. Sahi Ram Ji**, a long-serving Postman at the Nankhari Post Office.

Both speakers brought years of experience and firsthand knowledge of the Indian postal system and the career avenues it offers.

Key Highlights of the Lecture

1. Historical Perspective and Evolution

The session began with an engaging introduction to the genesis and historical evolution of the Indian Postal Services, one of the world's oldest communication networks. The speakers shared the journey of India Post from its colonial origins to its modernisation and digital empowerment as a public service institution.

2. Expansive Network and National Importance

The speakers highlighted the vast network of the Indian Postal Services, which spans over 1.5 lakh post offices across the country, including in the most remote and rural areas. They emphasised its critical role in bridging the communication gap, facilitating banking and financial inclusion, and supporting e-commerce and logistics in underserved regions.

3. **Employment Opportunities in the India Post**

Students were given detailed insights into the diverse employment opportunities offered by the Department of Posts. The speakers elaborated on various job roles, including:

- **Gramin Dak Sevak (GDS)**
- **Postman/Mail Guard**
- **Postal Assistant**
- **Sorting Assistant**
- **Multi-Tasking Staff (MTS)**
- **Inspector Posts**
- **Group 'A' Services through UPSC**

4. **Recruitment and Selection Process**

A crucial part of the lecture focused on how to apply and the eligibility criteria for various posts. The students were informed about:

- The online recruitment portals used by India Post
- Minimum educational qualifications
- Age limits and relaxations for various categories
- Selection processes including merit-based shortlisting, written exams, and skill tests (where applicable)
- The role of the India Post GDS Online Engagement Portal for rural positions

5. **Career Growth and Benefits**

The speakers shared valuable information about career progression, job stability, government benefits, and the possibility of internal promotions within the Indian Postal Service. They also emphasised the importance of public service and highlighted the vital role postal employees play in nation-building.

6. **Interactive Q&A Session**

The lecture concluded with an interactive question and answer session, where students enthusiastically asked queries regarding:


- Examination patterns


