Talk by Ms. Anjali (Batch 2015–2018)

He also discussed practical aspects, including current rental rates in the Nankhari area, understanding customer needs, and adopting simple business strategies to ensure sustainability and growth.

The session concluded with an engaging question–and–answer round where students put forward their queries related to career paths, local business opportunities, exam preparation, and skill development. The alumni patiently answered each question, offering practical, relatable advice.
