The primary objective of the workshop was to introduce students to the concept of early human stone tool making, the different types of tools, and the techniques used by prehistoric humans. The session aimed to:


1. **Familiarize students with prehistoric stone tools** such as cores, flakes, Burin, Blades, Hand axe and scrapers.
