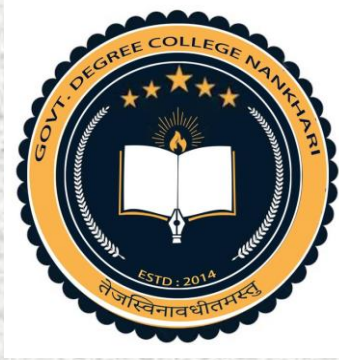

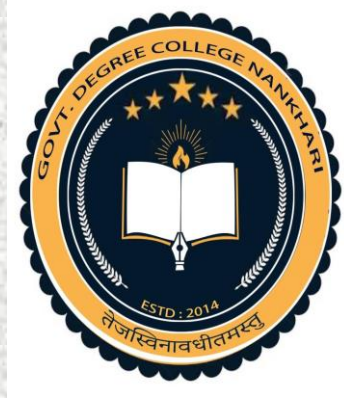

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Because of the challenging conditions only a few fortunate boys & girls could afford to go to either Rampur or Shimla to acquire higher education.

An Overview of the UGC-CBCS (Choice Based Credit System)

Undergraduate Programmes:

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising Core, Compulsory, Skill Enhancement and Elective Courses. The courses are evaluated by following a grading system. In order to bring uniformity in the evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Courses under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

1. **Core Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as Core Course.
2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective course offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - 2.2 **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
 - 2.3 **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** An elective course which is other than discipline specific core course and is chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic elective.
3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement: (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
 - 3.1 **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/Modern Indian Language (MIL) Communication.
 - 3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

For example, if a student has English as DSC I and Economics as DSC II, then he/ she can only choose History/ Hindi/ Political Science/ Music (I) as GE.

Evaluation System of Undergraduate CBCS Programme.

As per RUSA/HP University guidelines, the marks scheme for all undergraduate courses in annual system for **BA/B.Com** will be in the ratio of **70:30**, i.e., 70 marks for theory (Annual/Term End Examination) and 30 marks for **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)/Internal Assessment (IA)**. In annual system for all courses of **B.Com practical subjects** the ratio will be **50:20:30**, i.e. 50 marks for theory and 20 marks for **practical** (Annual/Term End) and 30 marks for **CCA/IA**.

As per University norms 30% marks of CCA will be determined by the concerned teacher in the annual system on the basis of following components:

1. House Test = 10
2. Term Test/Class Test = 05
3. Assignments/Seminars = 10
4. Class room attendance = 5

In the annual system class room attendance will be defined as follows:

75% — 80%	1 mark
80% — 85%	2 marks
85% — 90%	3 marks
90% — 95%	4 marks
95% and above	5 marks

Mid Term / House Test

- One **Mid Term/House Test** of 10 marks (Annual System) will be conducted in each academic year.
- It is mandatory for every student to appear in the Mid Term/House Test and the marks obtained shall contribute to the total IA/CCA of 30%.
- As per University guidelines the students who do not get 35% marks in IA/CCA will not be allowed to appear in Annual Examination.

Other Information Related to Evaluation

1. Internal Assessment/Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Term End Examinations will be as per RUSA provisions for annual system.
2. In annual system, the minimum passing marks is 40% in aggregate. However, it is mandatory to score 35% in CCA and also 35% in the Final Examination for passing.
3. A candidate failing either in one or two subjects/papers in annual examination will be placed under compartment in those subjects/papers. Such students will have only two chances-- one at supplementary stage and another at the annual stage to clear his/her compartment.
4. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and will have to repeat the entire year.
5. The result shall be declared as per grading system and the students will have to complete the degree within 5 years.
6. Re-evaluation shall be applicable as per provisions of HP University ordinance for annual system.
7. Final examinations shall be held in the month of March/April and supplementary examinations in the month of September/October every year.

Note: The above guidelines/conditions may vary as per latest notification by the University.

Admission to BA/ B.Com 1st Year:

(Note: All the admissions made by the college are provisional till regularized by H.P. University.)

Eligibility for Admission

1. **Bachelor of Arts (BA Pass Course):** The students who have passed +2 examinations or an examination equivalent to a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with 33% marks.
2. **Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com Pass Course):** The candidates with 40% marks in commerce stream or 45% marks in four written subjects, including English at +2 level, are eligible for admission to B.Com pass course. The minimum eligibility condition for a girl student to get admission in B.Com is 33% marks in +2 examination. However, for admission to B.Com pass course the candidate must have passed Mathematics or Economics as compulsory subject at his/her +2 stage.

- Note:**
- i. All the admissions in BA/ B.Com 1st Year will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination, that is, on the basis of percentage/marks of +2 examination.
 - ii. The student placed under compartment or failed in +2 examinations are not eligible for seeking admission.

Age Limit and Relaxation

1. Admission is not granted to the student in 1st Year if he/she has attained the age of 23 in the case of boys and 25 in the case of girls on 1st July of the year concerned.
2. The upper age limit will be raised by three years for students belonging to SC/ST categories.
3. The Principal has a discretion to provisionally grant age relaxation to the students of general category up to a maximum of six months subject to the final approval by the Vice-Chancellor of H.P. University.

General Instructions Related to the Admission Process for BA/ B.Com 1st Year:

1. The candidates will have to download the college prospectus from the college website <https://www.gcnankhari.edu.in/>. The candidates are advised to read the various instructions regarding admission in the prospectus before applying for admission online.
2. The candidates seeking admission can apply **online (through link available on college website) from 1st June, 2025 to 19th June, 2025. They will have to register themselves by making an account with a valid e-mail id on the admission portal available on the college website Please note that there is no provision of filling up forms in an offline mode.**
3. There will be Pre- Admission counselling for students seeking admission in the college from 12th June 2025 to 19th June 2025 in the college campus. The students can clear their doubts related to BA and B.Com programmes and the admission procedure as well.
4. **The subject-wise merit list will be displayed on the college website on 20th June 2025: <https://www.gcnankhari.edu.in/> as well as on the notice board of the college.**
5. The students appearing in the merit list will have to **deposit the prescribed fee online** within the stipulated period as per the HPU /College schedule that is from **21st June to 23rd June 2025. The fee link for the online payment will get reflected on the account created by the student on the college admission portal.**
6. After depositing the fee online, the students will have to appear before the admission committee for the **post-admission counseling and the physical verification of documents from 24th June 2025 to 26th June 2025 (for BA, B.Com 1st Year students) and from 27th June 2025 to 30th June 2025 (for BA, B.Com 2nd & 3rd Year students) in the college Campus. The students will have to bring the printout of the online admission form and other documents mentioned on Page No. 13 for the counselling and physical verification.**

Admission to BA/ B.Com 2nd & 3rd Year Along with Guidelines

1. Admission to BA/B.Com 2nd year and 3rd year is on **Roll on basis** for which they have to apply through **online mode only from 1st June 2025 to 19th June 2025**. The students will have to download the college prospectus from the college website <https://www.gcnankhari.edu.in/>. They can fill the online admission form by logging into the account created on the admission portal available on the college website in the previous year. **Please note that there is no provision of filling up the form in an offline mode.**
2. In the roll on system, the students who have studied in 1st and 2nd year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class, i.e. in 2nd and 3rd year respectively, **without waiting for the final result of the previous year.**
3. After filling up the online admission, the students should deposit the prescribed **fee within the stipulated period (12th June 2025 to 23rd June 2025)**. The fee link will appear in the account created on the admission portal.
4. The students will also **appear for the post-admission counselling and physical verification by the admission committee in the college on 27th June 2025 to 30th June 2025**. The students should bring the **printout of the online admission application** for the physical verification. Students taking admission in BA 3rd year should also attach the self-attested photocopy of the Marks sheet/ Grade Card of BA 1st year with the printout of the admission form.
5. **The students should note that it is compulsory for them (and their parents) to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every academic year.**

Note: The date for submitting the anti-ragging affidavit will be notified by the college after the commencement of regular classes.

Instructions to Students Taking Roll On Admission:

1. The students admitted in BA 2nd year will study two more courses-- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC 1 & SEC 2) -- in the subject/discipline of their first choice (DSC I) studied in 1st year. These two courses will be in additions to Core courses (DSCs & Compulsory English/Hindi) studied in 1st year.
2. The students admitted in BA 3rd year will study two Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE I & DSE II) and two Generic Elective Courses (GEs) along with two SECs (SEC 3 & SEC 4). It should be noted that DSE I & DSE II will be of the same discipline as DSC I & DSC II of the previous class respectively. The two GEs will be from any one discipline/ subject other than the two DSCs/DSEs.

Refusal And Cancellation of Admission: (In accordance with HPU Ordinance)

1. The Principal may grant or refuse admission to any student on the recommendation of the admission committee.
2. Admission will not be granted after the expiry of admission dates.
3. Cancellation of Provisional Admission at the time of physical verification: If any student fails to produce the original documents for verification, and submit the attested copies of required documents along with the Original Character certificate, Original Migration Certificate (if applicable) & Self Declaration for gap in education (format available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus), then his/her provisional admission can stand cancelled.

Fine Related to Absence in the Class:

- After continuous absence from a class for a period of 10 days in Annual System, the name of the student will be struck-off from the college rolls and the information for the same will be displayed on the notice board and college web site.
- Re-admission with Rs.100/- and Rs.200/- for the first and second time respectively will be allowed on very specific grounds. Re-admission for the third time will not be allowed.
- Absence fine will be charged from students as mentioned below:

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Leave Rules:

1. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission from the college Principal. The application should also be prior signed by parent/ guardian of the student and duly recommended by the teacher.
2. A teacher can sanction leave up to maximum of 5 days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the college Principal.

- **General leave will only be counted for the relaxation in fine only and not be counted as the lecture attended.**
- **In case of participation in sports, cultural, NSS and other activities, the credit will be given to the students and days engaged in these activities will be counted as lectures attended.**

Other Rules and Regulations:

1. Students will be issued identity cards by the college. It is mandatory for all the students to carry the identity cards to college every day.
2. It is mandatory for every student to maintain strict discipline within the college premises. Any act of a student that amounts to indiscipline will be dealt strictly. The following act comes within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct: -
 - Ragging in and around the college campus
 - Eve-teasing
 - Scribbling/ Writing anything on the white-board, smart boards, furniture, walls, etc.
 - Damaging college property-- Breaking furniture/ window panes/ Tempering electrical and water fittings
 - Removing notices
 - Holding any meeting/ function/ party in the college premises without any prior permission of the Principal
 - Using foul language in the campus
 - Bringing outsiders to the campus
 - Smoking/ chewing tobacco, taking drugs/ intoxicants/ alcohol anywhere in the college premises
 - Any other act or acts which the Principal considers as major acts of misconduct and indiscipline
3. All the students are directed to read the notices displayed on the college notice board every day and do the needful accordingly.
4. Use of mobile phones is prohibited in classrooms and examination hall.
5. The name of a student shall be struck off from the college rolls, if there is an absence without sanctioned leave continuously for 10 days or more.
6. Regarding Readmission: If the name of a student is struck off, he/ she must be accompanied by his/ her parent or guardian at the time of re-admission. **The student must seek re-admission within six days of the notice regarding the same.**

7. Legal proceeding under Criminal Law shall be initiated.

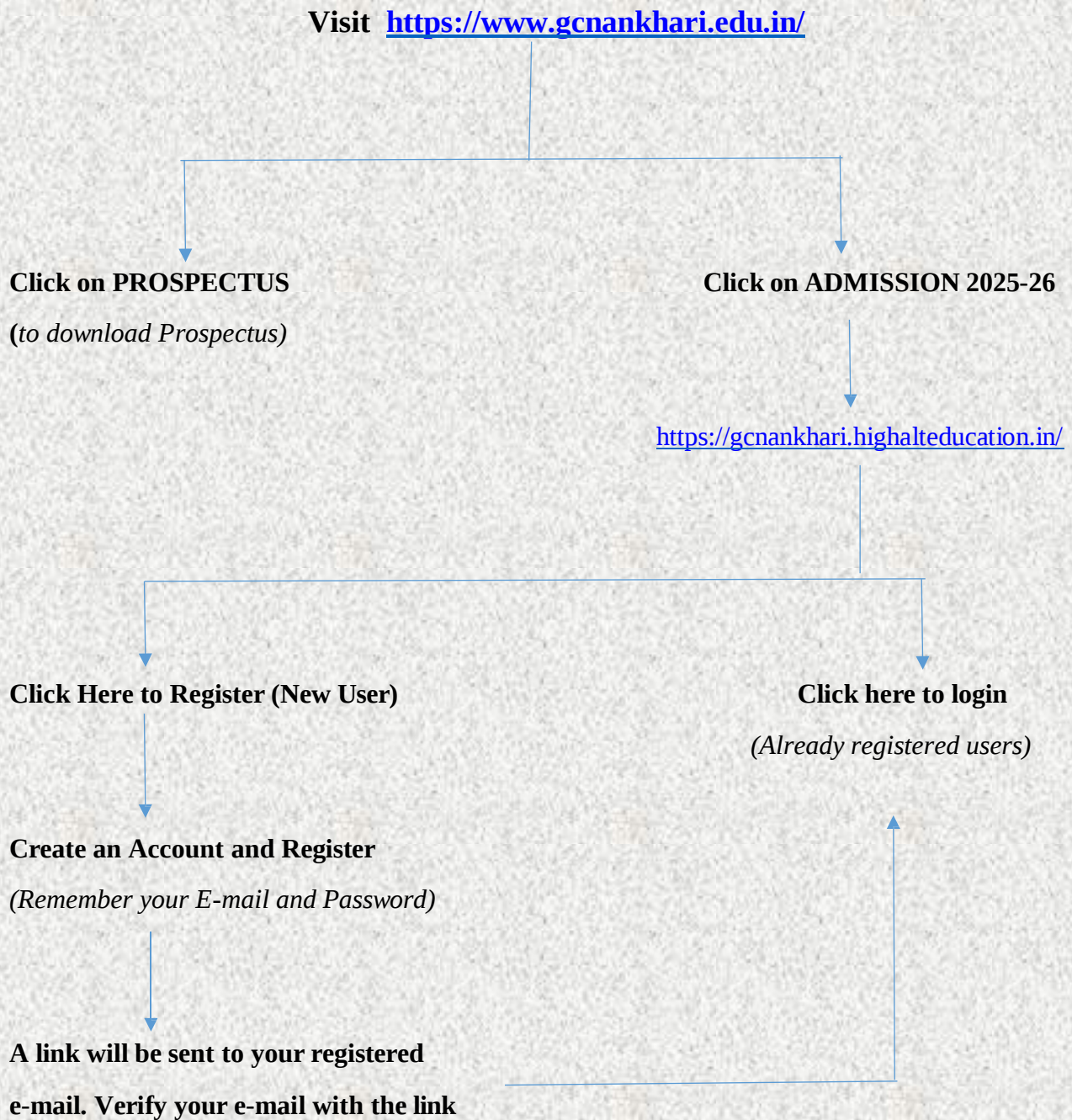
